



## MISSOURI SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

These requirements supplement the International Association of Industrial Accident Boards and Commission (IAIABC) Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) Release I Implementation Guide for the Report of Injury Record. ### 1. Formats

- The Missouri Division of Workers' Compensation and Trading Partners will use the IAIABC Report of Injury Release 1 148 Flat File or ANSI X12 Format on a voluntary basis. Missouri is currently working towards a mandate for EDI reporting. You will receive advance notification when the mandate is approved.
- Data shall be transmitted to meet all requirements in accordance with Missouri Division of Workers' Compensation required EDI Data Elements. See the Missouri Data Element and Trading Partner tables for specific data requirements.
- The 148 record layout will replace the hard copy, Employers Report of Injury or Illness. All flat file transmissions must have the Header and Trailer records.

### 2. Report Criteria

- Transmit all Reports of Injury in accordance with Section 287.380, RSMo for:
  - An injury or occupational disease of any employee; or the death of any employee.
  - Submit the 148, Report of Injury within 30 days after the employer's knowledge of an accident resulting in injury, occupational disease, or death to any employee.

### 3. Standards

- The Missouri Division of Workers' Compensation is currently in production with the 148 ROI Release 1, Maintenance Type Code "00" (Original), Change (02), and Correction (CO). Development is in progress on MTC Codes 01, 04, and AU. All trading partners will be notified when these filing options are available.
- If a Cancel (01), Denial (04), or Acquired/Unallocated (AU) is needed on a 148, a hard copy of the 148 or a brief letter will need to be sent to the Division, so that the information can be adjusted. The information included on the 148 or brief letter should include the correct maintenance type code, the agency claim number, employee name, employee's social security number, and the information that needs to be changed or corrected.
- The Missouri Division of Workers' Compensation is also in production with the IAIABC POC Proof of Coverage record. If you are interested in transmitting EDI POC data, please contact the Division at (573) 526-4943 for more information.

#### 4. Forms

- The Missouri WC-1-EDI Employer's Report of Injury or Illness paper form shall continue to be filed with the Division until completion of the test pilot. Trading Partners will be granted approval by the Division to move into EDI production and to stop sending the paper reports. **Once a Trading Partner has been moved into EDI production, paper reports will no longer be accepted.**

#### 5. Acknowledgments

- Acknowledgments will be sent on every transmission. The IAIABC 824 AK1 Detailed Acknowledgment format will be used. Acceptable IAIABC formats include Transaction Accepted ('TA'), Transaction Accepted With Errors ('TE'), Transaction Rejected ('TR') and Batch Rejected ('HD'). Only approved error codes 001 through 100 from the IAIABC Release I Edit Matrix Table will be used. All errors on 'TE' and 'TR' formats will be contained in the acknowledgment record. Some error records will contain additional supporting text in DN113 Free Form Text. All 'TA' and 'TE' formats will include the state assigned injury number. The AK1 Detailed Acknowledgment format is contained in the Missouri Trading Partner Table.

#### 6. Test Pilot

- Transmit all ROI in Test Status during the Test Pilot. A "T" in DN104 Test Production Indicator in the Header Record indicates this. The Header format is contained in the Missouri Trading Partner Table. We prefer at least two successful data submissions during the test pilot. Detailed Acknowledgments will be sent for each batch of test pilot records. Modifications to the test pilot can be negotiated with each trading partner on an individual basis as needed. When a successful pilot has been concluded, we will contact you with approval to move into production.
- During the pilot, continue to send the WC-1-EDI paper reports corresponding to the EDI 148 records through the normal paper processing channels to allow continued processing of production data as required during the test pilot.

#### 7. Edits

- The trading partner must meet all data edits and mandatory field requirements as outlined in the Missouri Trading Partner table.
- All code values with references are described in detail in the Missouri Data Element and Trading Partner Tables.

#### 8. Vendors

- IAIABC can provide a list of previously certified vendors or you can search the Internet to find vendors. Remember, not all vendors are experienced in this technology or workers' compensation requirements.
